

PASTORAL TRANSITION – a note from the Session and the Pastor Members and friends of our church received an email communication from Pastor Jim on Tuesday evening (August 19, 2025) sharing the news of his decision to retire from active ministry for personal and family reasons. In conversation together Jim, as our Pastor, and the Session covenanted to work together, as we always have done, to ensure that this transition occurs smoothly.

We quote a portion of Jim's letter to the Congregation:

"A Congregational Meeting has been called for Sunday, September 28, 2025, to act on my request to dissolve the pastoral relationship. The Rev. Casto-Waters (General Presbyter, Cherokee Presbytery) will moderate this meeting.

Though my time as your Pastor may be shorter than we all hoped, I will always be deeply grateful for the opportunity to serve Deer Creek Shores—the concluding chapter of my ministry, which began with my ordination as a Minister of Word and Sacrament in 1987. These thirty-eight years of ordained service (almost one third of which were spent within Cherokee Presbytery) have been rich and fulfilling, and now I look forward to new thoughts, experiences, and opportunities in retirement.

In the weeks ahead, I remain fully available to you as your Pastor and will do all I can to support and assist during this transition. The Session will be working on all that is needed as I and the church navigates this transition.

Your prayers for Janice, our family, and me are deeply appreciated as we move into this new chapter. You have my prayers, and the prayers of our entire family.

Jim's last Sunday in worship leadership will be Sunday, September 21, and the Session is making plans to celebrate his time with us and to mark his retirement. Everyone is asked to pray for Jim, and Janice, and their family, and for our congregation as we adjust to this news and look to the future God has for all of us.
